The Project Management Overview class is a 1/2 day class providing students with an introduction to the fundamental processes, concepts and tools of project management. Students gain awareness and understanding of what is involved in planning and managing projects.



The technical part of the workshop is based on the Project
Management Institute's "A Guide to the Project Management Body of Knowledge" (PMBOK®). The PMBOK is the accepted standard throughout most of the world

COST today. Participants are provided with an overview of the PMBOK's

basic processes of project initiation, planning, execution, control, and closure. Also coverd are the nine Knowledge Areas of the PMBOK.

The soft side of project management is covered by looking at the five key project management variables and their relationships, with particular focus on the leadership factors that most influence the productivity of the team.


